



## Friendly Iran -8-day Iran Tour



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Detailed Itinerary:

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## Day 1: Arrival in Tehran – Welcome to Persia

Arrive in Tehran, where a warm welcome awaits your family. Check into a comfortable, family-friendly hotel with spacious rooms and a peaceful garden.

Evening walk in **Tajrish Bazaar** and **Darband**, where children can enjoy local snacks and colorful mountain cafés.

**Overnight:** Tehran

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## Day 2: Tehran – Mini Adventures in the Capital

Morning visit to the **National Museum** with a child-focused storytelling tour — ancient Persia comes alive through myths and treasures.

Afternoon visit to **Sa'dabad Palace**, where kids can explore royal costumes and carriages.

Evening free for family relaxation or a visit to a nearby park for a picnic dinner.

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## Day 3: Isfahan – Where Art Meets Imagination

Drive to Isfahan .

Lunch in a traditional restaurant with live folk music.

Afternoon picnic by **Zayandeh River** near the Si-o-se-pol Bridge.

Optional: evening stroll with **lanterns** at the bridge for a magical memory.

**Overnight:** Isfahan

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## Day 5: Yazd – Desert Stories and Windcatchers

Drive to Yazd (approx. 4 hours).

Visit the **Old City of Yazd**, with its clay alleys and wind towers.

Family activity: make a **mini windcatcher** from clay with local artisans.

Evening visit to **Amir Chakhmaq Square**, where lights and music fill the night.

**Overnight:** Yazd

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## Day 6: Yazd – Simple Life, Big Smiles

Visit **Dowlat Abad Garden**, where kids can find the “tallest wind tower in Iran.”

Enjoy a tea break with Yazdi sweets.

Free afternoon for families to relax or explore the bazaar (perfect for parents to shop, while kids enjoy ice cream).

**Overnight:** Yazd

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## Day 7: Shiraz – The City of Poetry and Color

Morning drive to Shiraz (approx. 5 hours).

Visit **Nasir al-Mulk Mosque (Pink Mosque)** — kids will love chasing the rainbow lights through stained glass.

Evening in **Eram Garden**, where families can feed the fish and enjoy a picnic among flowers.

**Overnight:** Shiraz

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## Day 8: Shiraz – Farewell with Love

Morning visit to **Persepolis** (short drive) — told as a story of kings and heroes that captivates both parents and children.

Return to Shiraz for departure with beautiful memories — and maybe a few handmade souvenirs from your family’s Persian journey.
